Main Speaker: Dr. T.V. Thomas

Dr. T.V. Thomas was born in Malacca, Malaysia and is the Director of the Centre for Evangelism & World Mission. Early on, Dr. Thomas learned to appreciate the role of prayer in evangelism. As one of 7 believers among 2000 high school students, he began to meet with four others to pray for fellow students by name. By the time he graduated, more than 400 had given their lives to Christ!

While completing his B.A. and B.Sc. at Nagpur University in India, Dr. Thomas also served with Asia Youth For Christ and Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship. Sensing the call of God on his life for full-time vocational ministry, Dr. Thomas came to North America for theological training and completed his doctoral studies in 1978. Following his ordination as an evangelist of the Christian and Missionary Alliance, he served on the teaching faculty of Canadian Bible College and Canadian Theological Seminary for 16 years.

Dr Thomas's deep commitment to the cause of world evangelization calls for extensive national and international travel. He has been a main speaker at events such as Urbana Student Missions Convention, MissionFest, and Promise Keepers conferences. Dr. Thomas makes his home in Regina with his wife Mary, and children Victor, Molly and Melanie.

NOTES FOR APPLICANTS

1. Eligibility:

- **Individual:** The MINIMUM age to apply individually as an INDEPENDENT APPLICANT is 13. However, those age 17 or under MUST personally secure an On-site Guardian (see 2.) and submit a completed Parent/Guardian Release Form.
- **Family:** There should be one MAIN APPLICANT age over 18 who will represent his/her family. Other members of the family can apply as ADDITIONAL APPLICANTS.
- **Children under the age of 13:** MUST be accompanied by his/her parent or On-site Guardian to the conference. He/She is NOT eligible to apply individually.
- **Age classification:** The age cut-off date is August 6, 2010 (1st day of the conference).

2. On-site Guardian:

- You must be married, a full-time attendant, and have NO MORE THAN 2 applicants under your guardianship.

3. Children's Program:

- There are children's programs for ages 3 to 12 in the morning (9:00am–11:45am), and evening (7:15pm–8:30pm).
- For any kids age 3 to 12, one of the parents has to help at the children's program for one session (1.5 hours). Details will be given at a later date.

4. Other Information:

- Please indicate any allergies, medical/health concerns and other special needs on the registration form.
- A “Things to Bring” checklist and a road map will be distributed two weeks prior to the conference date.

5. At the Conference:

- The general “on-site” registration will be held on August 6 from 4:00pm to 5:00pm. Please plan to arrive during that period of time. Report to Frank Grisdale Hall (FGH) upon arrival to pickup room keys, handbook, and name tags.
- Use parking lots 5 or 6 only.
- Dinner will be served from 5:30pm to 7:00pm that evening. There will be NO food-reservation service for latecomers.
- NO attendant can change his/her assigned room and workshops without prior approval from the chairman of the conference planning committee.
- Name tags MUST BE WORN at all times during the Conference. There will be a penalty of \$5 for the replacement of name tags.
- The bedroom key must be returned to the conference registrar before leaving the conference. If the applicant loses the key, he/she is responsible to pay a fee (\$25 per key). This fee is not included in the application fee.
